

# WIZARD OF OZ

**COWARDLY LION**

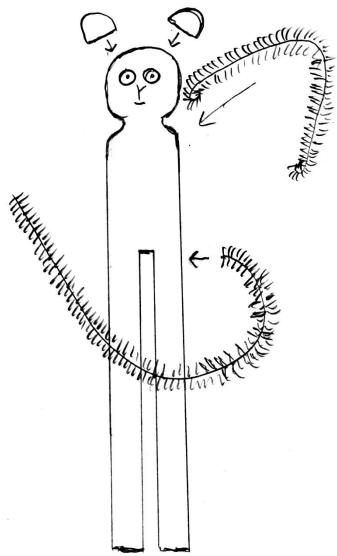

- 1) Paint entire clothespin brown. If you have some white paint, you may want to mix a light brown color and paint the face and belly light brown. Let it dry.
- 2) Glue the ends of a 12 inch long 1/8 inch hanging ribbon onto the back of the clothespin halfway between the neck and the legs.



- Parts List**
- 2 small wiggle eyes
  - 1 round clothespin
  - 2 - 4 inch brown chenille stems
  - 2 - 12" 1/8" red hanging ribbons
  - 2 brown ears felt cutouts
  - 1 mane felt cutout
  - 1"x1" brown fur

4) Bend the tips of one of the pieces of chenille stem over to make hands and put a slight bend in the center. Glue this on the back of the clothespin over the hanging ribbon. See figure 2. Let them dry thoroughly.

6) Glue the second piece of chenille stem inside the clothespin between the legs so it sticks out the back. See figures 1 and 2.

7) Glue the ears to the top of the head as seen in figure 1. Let them dry.

8) Wrap the mane cut from felt around the face and behind the ears so that the ends meet under the chin. Glue in place. (note: this is a new addition. Picture not available.)

9) Cut a bunch of fur loose from the piece of fur supplied in the kit. Cover the back and top of the head and the chin of the lion with glue and attach the fur. Try to "plant" the fur so only one end is glued to the clothespin and it sticks out all over. See figure 3. Don't worry about how it looks right now. After the glue dries, give him a haircut. Do the same thing to the tip of the lion's tail.

10) Glue on eyes and make a face using a fine felt tip pen.

11) Place the tail in the lion's hand.

12) To make a bow tie cut a piece of 1/8 inch red ribbon about 12 inches long. Fold the ribbon back and forth to form two loops (or bunny ears). Tie the two bunny ears together, left over right as if you were making a common knot with two strings. Alternate back and forth pulling the ends and the pulling the bow until it is tight and the desired size. See figure to the left. Trim the ends and glue it to the lion's head.

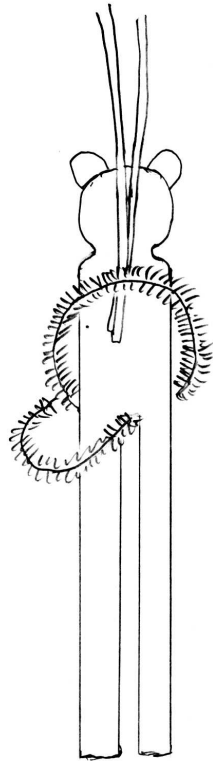

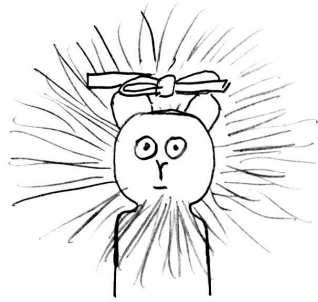
