

Wizard of Oz Tin Man

1) Cut out the ax, collar and funnel hat from the paper sheet included in your kit. Curl the funnel around and glue the ends to create the funnel shaped hat. Leave a small opening in the small end for the small bugle bead. Glue the bugle bead inside the opening. Next, cut out a small strip of paper and glue it into a circle for the handle. Glue the handle to the side of the funnel. See figure 2. Set it aside to dry.

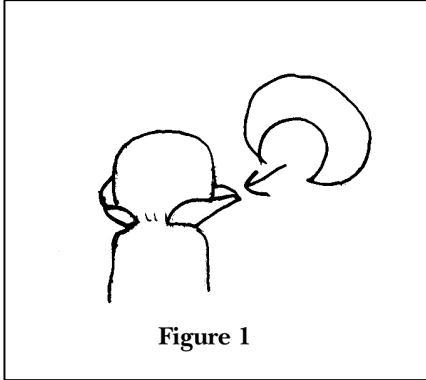

2) Decide which will be the front of the clothespin. Place glue around the neck and wrap the collar around so the opening is in the front. Glue the collar so it sticks out around the base of the head. See figure 1.

3) Cut the craft pick down to 2 1/2 inches by cutting off the thinner end. Next, fold the ax head cutout in half around the thinner end of the craft pick as seen in figure 2.

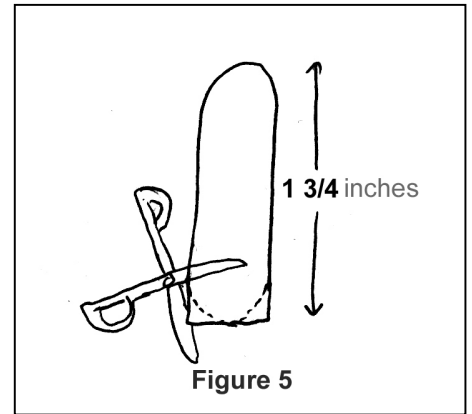

4) Glue a wood bead to each shoulder, one on each side of the clothespin. Cut two arms from the craft sticks 1 3/4 inches long. A good pair of scissors will cut the sticks. Round the ends. See figure 5.

Be patient when gluing on the arms. Do them one at a time and wait for the glue to dry. You may need to cut a small jig to hold the arms up until they dry.

5) Glue the ax to the inside of the right arm. See figure 2.

6) Next, glue 5 small seed beads down the front of the clothespin as in figure 2. These are the Tin Man's rivets. Glue his nose to the middle of his face but do not glue on the eyes yet.

7) Glue the funnel on his head slightly tipped to one side (His hat was never on straight).

8) Before you paint the Tin Man, it is very important to let all the glue dry thoroughly. When the glue is dry, paint everything silver. Let the paint dry completely before you continue.

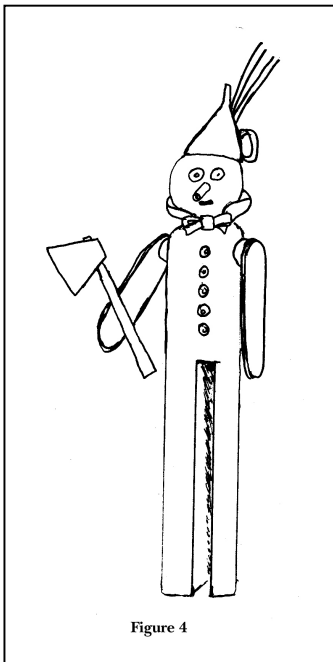

9) Cut a piece of 1/8" ribbon about 12 inches long and tie it into a bow like you would tie your shoe. Pull the ends carefully until you make a small bow. Glue it to the top of the Tin Man's chest.

10) Glue on the Tin Man's eyes and use a felt tip pen to make a mouth. The mouth should be straight and short like you see in figure 2 and 4.

11) Finally, cut a piece of 1/8" hanging ribbon about 12 inches long and glue the ends to the back of the Tin Man's head. See figure 3.

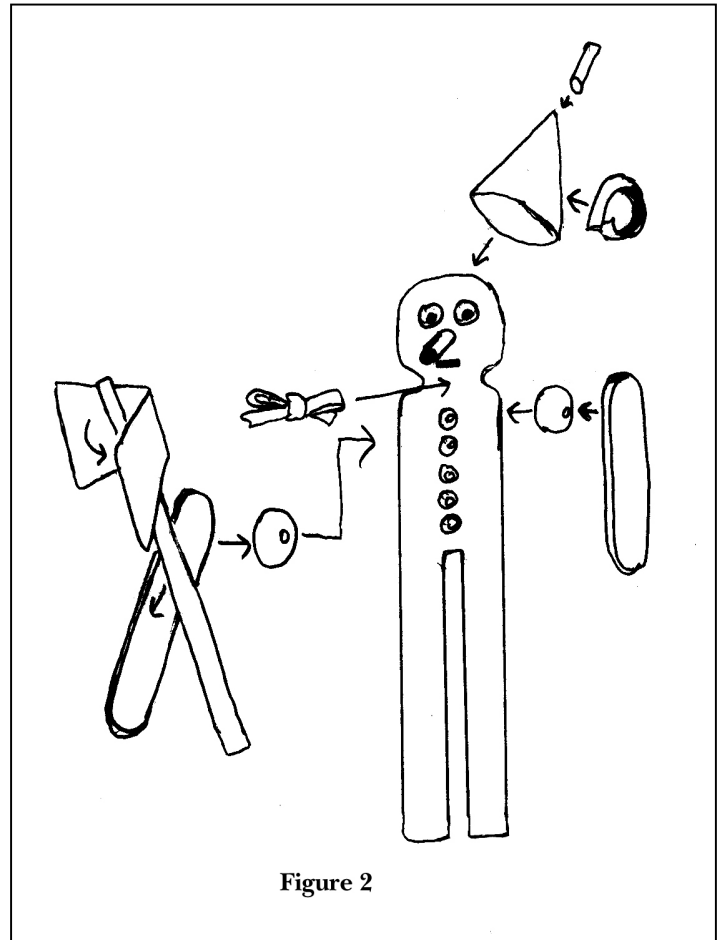

- 1 round clothespin
- 1 craft stick
- 1 craft pick
- 24" 1/8" ribbon (silver)
- 1 Cutout sheet

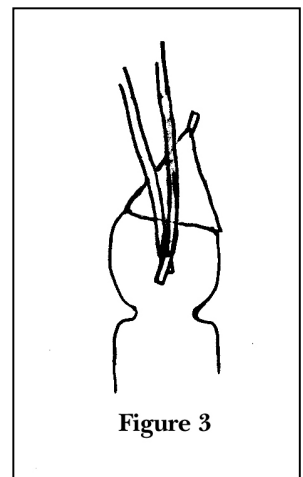
